Discovery Days 2022 Sessions

1-Hour Sessions – Youth Choose 2 options – June 1 afternoon

Developing Teamwork Through Hands-On Learning Within a Classroom

Throughout our time together, we will be conducting problem-solving games that focus on teamwork and building a trusting environment. Intermixed between activities will be short conversations on how these activities relate to leadership and/or team-building.

Listening to Understand Perspectives: Using Art Discussion to Model Civic Discourse

Visual Thinking Strategies, a open-ended method for discussing art, serves as a model for the Principles of Civic Discourse. Improve your communication skills and learn the difference between listening to argue a point versus listening to understand multiple perspectives.

Exploring Health Careers

When you think about health careers, what comes to mind? Doctor? Nurse? This session will explore a wide variety of health careers, including what educational qualifications are required and how students can begin to get experience in fields of interest.

Gray for a Day

Gray for a Day is a simulation experience that utilizes an empathic approach to educate individuals on age-related sensory and functional challenges that some older adults might face. Participants will get to "gear up" as older adults experience what it may be like to get older.

Geotrooping

Using GPS technology, participants will decipher clues and participate in a treasure hunt. Using field guides, correctly identifying Kansas plants and animals will lead the treasurer hunters to success. Learning to use a compass will also be explored.

Preserving Kansas History, Past and Present: Creative Methods to Archive and Record History

This session invites youth to discover Kansas history at the Chapman Center for Rural Studies! Attendees will take a closer look at our autograph albums, real-life artifacts that document the lives of women in 19th century Kansas. Using these albums as a jumping-off point, attendees will create their own mini autograph albums, imagining life through a past historical lens.

Unlock Ag Innovations

Unlock the secrets of agricultural innovation in this escape room challenge! By the year 2050, it is estimated that the world population will exceed nine billion people. That would mean an increase in

food production by 60%. Join us to learn how farmers are using innovation and technology to insure a safe, sustainable food source for the future for our communities, our country and our world.

Your Gift: Inspiration and Entrepreneurship

During this session, students will be able to identify their "gift" and explore how to turn something they do well, with the least amount of effort into a business! We will discuss different start-up ideas, innovation, and the entrepreneurial mindset.

Making Japanese Friends

In this session, two Japanese High School students, who attended schools in Kansas as 4-H Academic Year Program (AYP) Exchange students, will share their experiences as teens in two different home areas. Hiyori near Tokyo, one of the worlds largest cities, and Sayo in a rural area in northern Japan affected by the tsunami and resulting in nuclear disaster. The students will teach about their lifestyles at school and in their home communities, as well as typical foods, leisure activities, clothing, language and crafts through a PowerPoint presentation, demonstrations, and hands-on group activities.
